Engaging Students in Zoom Using Chats

You can allow Zoom meeting participants to chat with other participants, or you can restrict any one-onone chatting. Chat can be used to collaborate within sessions for impromptu questions or planned questions outside of a poll.

Remember the **WIIFM** acronym: What's In It For Me? The chat can provide students a method to express themselves without verbal interaction; the chat can also allow students to communicate directly with you. You can chat privately with a student during the session.

This session shows how to use the chat feature during your live Zoom class.

CHAT IN ZOOM

1. What is the Chat feature in Zoom?

Chat is an instant messaging tool to send notes to users within a meeting. Chats can be private one-toone or sent to an entire group. The host sets these parameters. Chats can be saved manually or automatically. Note: private chats cannot be viewed by the host.

2. Enable Chat:

The meeting must have enabled the Chat feature. This is found in "My Settings" in your Zoom profile.



3. While in a meeting, click Chat in the meeting controls.



4. This will open the chat on the right. You can type a message into the chat box or click on the drop down next to To: if you want to send a message to a specific person.



5. When new chat messages are sent to you or everyone, a preview of the message will appear, and Chat will flash orange in your host controls.

While Screen Sharing 'mode', if you don't see the Chat option, click 'More' and choose Chat. A floating chat window will appear. If you receive new chat messages while screen share, the more button will flash orange to indicate the incoming message. You can click on **More**, then **Chat** to open the window.

6. Changing In-Meeting Chat Settings

If you're the meeting host, you can change the in-meeting chat settings.

- ✓ While in a meeting, click **Chat** in the meeting controls.
- ✓ Click **More** to display in-meeting chat settings.



- ✓ You can access the following options:
 - Save chat: Save all chat messages in a TXT file.
 - Share file in meeting: Send a file in the chat.
 - Allow attendees to chat with: Control who participants can chat with.

Chat is a tool that can bring connectivity and engagement to your classes. Some students are more willing to type a text-style message or comment than speak in front of a camera. This type of engagement will engage more students using quick and effective communication
