degree in three

DSU's Degree in Three option provides students with the same coursework and curriculum as a traditional four-year degree, but in a different timeframe.

- Computer Science, B.S.
 - Students can earn their degree even faster than the *degree in three* plan depending on their previously earned college credits and math test placements.
- Cyber Operations, B.S.
 - Students can complete their bachelor's degree in three years, or they can participate in the 4+1 program to complete their bachelor's degree in three years and their M.S. in Computer Science in five years.
- Elementary Education, B.S.E.
 - Students take 12–15 credits per semester as a full-time student.
- Network & Security Administration, B.S.
 - Students take 15 credits per semester as a full-time student.



featured scholarships

champion scholarships

\$3,000 to \$20,000 over four academic years

Awarded at different levels to on-campus, incoming freshmen. These scholarship levels are dependent upon your high school GPA and standardized test scores and can be renewed annually.

dsu rising scholarships

\$20,000 over four academic years

The DSU Rising Annual Scholarships are a four-year guarantee of up to \$20,000 (\$5,000 per year). You don't need to apply for DSU Rising Scholarships—we award them automatically based on certain academic criteria upon admission.

horatio alger denny sanford scholarship

\$10,000 over four academic years

Established in 2018, the Horatio Alger Denny Sanford Scholarship helps high school seniors who have overcome great obstacles. The scholarship awards \$10,000 dispersed throughout your college experience.

Starting in late fall you can apply for federal financial aid with the FAFSA. You can also apply for DSU Foundation Scholarships any time September 1 – March 1.






